As we come to the close of semester one, I wish to highlight five key points.

CISSA end of semester function

As usual, the Catholic Institute of Sydney's Student Association (CISSA) will be holding their end of semester function next week. This is where a portion of the membership fee goes (the other significant part is to stock and maintain the student kitchen and common room). All lectures in week 12 will finish 30 minutes earlier to allow time for the students to gather for their end of semester function where food and fellowship will be offered. In other words, morning classes will finish at 12:00 pm and evening classes at 8:30 pm. I also take this opportunity to thank our student representatives and Angelina for their work in facilitating this.

Registration for next semester

For those continuing to study and haven't registered for semester two, Rather than repeating everything here, I draw your attention to the registration poster on the student notice board outside the Gerard Kelly Lecture Room.

Semester results

Over the next few weeks, the lecturers will submit all student results to the registry office. The registry will process and prepare these for presentation at the CIS Assessment Review Committee. Following this, the results will be monitored by the Academic Standards Committee of the Sydney College of Divinity (SCD). Please note, all results are provisional until the Academic Board of the SCD approves them. After this, your final result will be sent to you in early July.

Graduation

For some of you, this current semester may be your final one with us in your studies. If you believe that you are eligible to graduate in 2019, please complete the 'Initial Application for SCD Graduation', which can be found on the registry shelves and on our website. This will need to be lodged with me or placed in the registry chute by the 7th of January 2019. The ceremony next year will be held on Saturday the 19th of May.

CIS Online

Another reminder that we will be launching CIS Online for the first time next semester. This will supplement the face to face classes with online access to their readings and other material. Students should receive an email towards the end of June or in July with login details. Students will use their student number as the username, and a temporary password will be supplied via email.
