



From the Registrar:

During the past few weeks, the registry has been busy preparing for the 2019 academic year while the semester is progressing in a usual manner. As there nothing major to report at this stage, I thought it would be helpful (and hopefully interesting for you) if I explained our course unit coding system.

There are four elements to the course unit code, they are the Discipline, Australian Qualification Framework (AQF) level, series level and unique identifier. For example, the BTh unit 'B7110 Introduction to Biblical Studies' can be spilt in this way B-7-1-10. The B designates it is a Biblical Studies unit. The 7 indicates that it is level 7 in the AQF of the Australian Government that regulates Australian education and training qualifications and classifies these qualifications according to levels from 1–10. As you can see from the below image, AQF level 7 relates to Bachelor's Degrees.

While the AQF policy covers all Australian post-secondary qualifications, what's most relevant to us here at CIS, at least with respect to units in our coursework degrees, are the levels 7, 8, 9 of the AQF. For CIS, broadly speaking, Level 7 degrees are bachelor degrees. Level 8 qualifications are Graduate Certificate and Diploma qualifications. And Level 9 qualifications are master's level.

The third element, ('1' in this example) level indicates that it is a foundational unit. The fourth element ('10' in this example) simply provides each course unit with a unique identifier.

Below is a table to illustrate these elements:

	Undergraduate Example	Postgraduate Example
Discipline	B	B
AQF Level	7	8
Series Level	1	5
Unique Identifier	10	10

Some other examples may help. P7101 is a foundational bachelor's-level unit in Pastoral Theology. H7240 is an intermediate bachelor's level unit in History. S7350 is a specialized bachelor's level unit in Spirituality. W8506 is a Graduate Diploma level unit in Philosophy (most 8000 level units can be counted towards a master's degree). And T9601 is a Theology unit at a master's level.

One final point about the new timetable: when it comes to registration week in Week 13, please make sure you have the most up-to-date copy of the timetable. We have tried to ensure that it is as complete as possible, but some changes to it are (unfortunately) inevitable.
