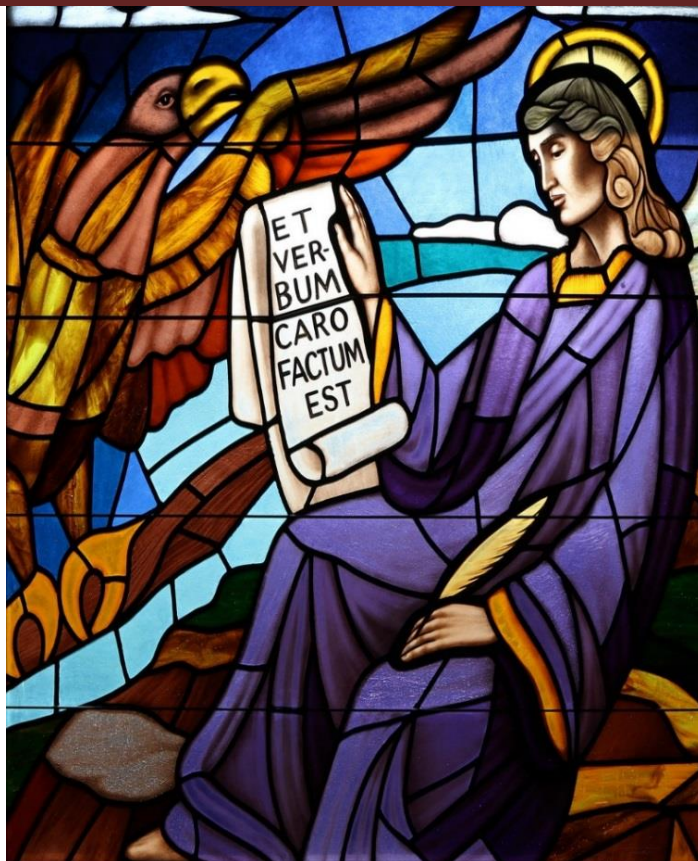

Using the knowledge and skills already acquired in Biblical Studies, this course on the Gospel of John examines the historical, cultural and religious background of the Johannine community. We will identify the principal literary forms in the Fourth Gospel and show how they communicate their theological content as well as using established methodologies to exegete selected passages from the Fourth Gospel. Participants will have access to and make use of the significant secondary literature available from the Veech collection for the critical study of the Fourth Gospel. Further, they will apply insights gained from the Johannine Gospel to contemporary Christian worship, teaching and spirituality. This course will focus in the main on the Gospel of John using canonical and non-canonical texts only insofar as they facilitate the interpretation of the Gospel of the fourth evangelist.

Classes will involve lectures, group work, seminar presentations and practical skills development for the exegesis and interpretation the Gospel for the community of believers in the contemporary context.
