Associate Professor Matthew Del Nevo has written a number of books in the area of soul and soulfulness. Both psychology and spirituality lay claim to having to do with the soul, as do the arts. But there is uncertainty about the soul: is it the mind? Is it the spirit? While spirituality may have us ascending Mt Carmel or the ladder of divine ascent, and while psychology may be doing behavioural modification, the soul can go missing. The **soul is about the deep and invisible currents** that make us what we are, developing inner sensibility and sensitivity, harmony and beauty in the mundane, the ordinary and everyday, using our imagination, inner preparations, individuation, infused gifts and acquired virtues, the *anima mundi*. All these are important in ministry, in caring for ourselves and others at a psychological level, and important for a genuine spiritual growth.
